

It was hosted by the Portuguese Centre for the History of Science and Technology (CIUHT).



275 participants from 27 countries (UK: 33, Portugal: 25, Italy 24, Germany 18, Netherlands: 10, Czechia: 10, USA: 8, Poland 5, etc. informed themselves in 2 parallel sessions of 54 oral and 47 posters on Hipoms (historic polymeric materials).






Main Topics have been 'Hipoms' Heritage', 'Hipoms' History', 'Museums, Collections, Archives', 'Preservation, Conservation, Characterisation', 'Scientific Analysis for the Conservation of Cellulose Acetate', 'Hipoms in Art, Design', 'Plastics and Environment'.



At Wednesday, 29 May, the participants could relax at the welcome reception in the wonderful ambience of the historic Reservatório da Mãe d'Água (water reservoir and distribution, 1745) in the Lisbon quarter Amoreiras.



At Thursday 30 May, the noon to evening, an excursion to the town Leiria (120 Km distance from Lisbon, centre of Portuguese plastics industry) took place. The exquisite lunch in Grelha Restaurant was followed by a viewing the film "All Things Bakelite" by Hugh Karraker (great grandson of Leo Baekeland) with a subsequent round table discussion.



After having visited the interesting, new, permanent plastics exhibition at the Museum of Leiria, the Mayor of Leiria gave a welcome reception in the stylish cloister of the former Convent Santo Agostinho.
